**The Overlook:** This backland lot was donated to Bolton Conservation Trust by the Stephenson family in 2011. It has been leased by Nashoba Valley Winery to extend their vineyard and heritage apple orchards.

Although the hiking is limited on this land, the short trail follows a dirt access road to a high point with a view of Bolton Town Center. There is some level ground which is an ideal spot to take photographs, watch wildlife, set up an easel for painting or just sit and read. Visitors to the nearby winery can enhance their experience by crossing Wattaquaddock Hill Road and taking in the view.

**Parking:** Wattaquaddock Hill Rd, gravel parking area.

**Connections:** The traffic can be heavy and the pavement narrow, so be careful if taking these walks.

*Bolton Town Common and trails* (Map 4) are further down Wattaquaddock Hill Road and across Route 117.

*Veterans Memorial Park* - sports ground and war memorial are a short walk down Wattaquaddock Hill Road.

**Exploration:** *Nashoba Valley Winery:* Orchard, Vineyard and shop.

*Bolton Town Center:* Library, Historical Society, Coffee Shop, Churches, Town Hall.

## Bolton Conservation Land Rules and Regulations

The Bolton Conservation Commission welcomes responsible public use and enjoyment of land under its stewardship. Pursuant to Massachusetts General Laws chapter 40, section 8c, the Conservation Commission has adopted these rules and regulations to provide a pleasant experience to users and in order to protect in perpetuity the wildlife, aesthetic, ecological, environmental and conservation values of these properties, which include:

- Protection of surface and groundwater resources
- Protection of unfragmented forest habitat.
- Protection of wildlife habitat
- Protection of open space and the trails system

### Prohibitions

- Hunting, trapping and discharging of firearms, arrows, paintballs and pellets
- Motor vehicles, except for emergency response or municipal vehicles
- Dumping and/or littering
- Alcoholic beverages and glass containers
- Smoking
- Swimming except wading by the Tom Denney Nature Camp

### Advance Permission Needed in Writing from the Bolton Conservation Commission for the following:

- Camping
- Fires
- Memorials or Displays
- Building new trails, extensions and modifications to existing trails
- Cutting removing or damaging vegetation, except for the control of invasive species
- Collecting dead or downed wood, rocks or wildlife.

Any activities or uses not set forth here require the prior written permission of the Bolton Conservation Commission.
